

Uniform Wear and Care

1. Always remove your shoes before putting your uniform on and taking it off.
2. Do not eat or drink in the uniforms (water is the exception).
3. Do not spray perfume or cologne on the uniforms.
4. Do not wear jewelry, including watches, when in your uniform.
5. We have worked hard to get the uniforms ready this year, however we may have missed some problems or something may break during the marching year. Please let one of the Quartermasters know if there is a problem with your uniform or garment bag. Your Quartermasters are:

6. Nothing is to be stored in the main section of your garment bag but your uniform. There is a pocket in back for the temporary storage of your shorts, shirt and gloves.
7. Shoes are not to be stored in the garment bags.
8. Please follow the proper uniform hanging procedures. If it is not hung correctly after a performance, you will not be allowed to return it to the racks until it is correctly hung.
9. The double uniform racks may present a problem for some students. If you need to be on a bottom rack, please let one of the Quartermasters or Mrs. Martin know so we can move your uniform to a bottom rack.
